

GreenEdu Empowerment Foundation

Founded by Ms. Nidhi in August 2024, the GreenEdu Empowerment Foundation (Greenee Foundation) was established with a clear and compassionate mission: to uplift underprivileged communities across India, with education as the cornerstone of lasting social change. Deeply moved by widespread poverty and systemic injustice, Greenee stands as a living expression of “Love in Action.”

In its first year, Greenee launched the “Bhikh Nahi, Kitab Do” campaign—a school book donation drive aimed at ensuring that children from low-income families have access to quality learning materials. The initiative reached several neighborhoods and laid the foundation for long-term educational support.

Greenee has also conducted awareness sessions for women empowerment and promoted environmental sustainability through local campaigns. From gender rights to green practices, we are building a culture of awareness and action.

Looking forward, one of our key goals is to offer NIOS coaching for working-class youth—such as security guards, pantry staff, and housekeeping workers—helping them complete their 10th and 12th-grade education. This initiative is designed to expand their career prospects and break the cycle of poverty.


Our broader vision includes:

- Establishing quality schools across small towns in North India
- Setting up Basic and Adult Literacy Centers (BLCs and ALCs) in underserved communities
- Providing skill-building programs in:
 - Basic computer literacy
 - Spoken English
 - Personality development
 - Career guidance
 - Music and dance

We also plan to run relief distribution drives for essential items such as clothing, shoes, food, stationery, school bags, and blankets—especially targeting vulnerable families during times of need.

As we reflect on our first year, we’re proud of these humble beginnings and remain committed to scaling our efforts with compassion, purpose, and community support.

OBJECTIVES

EDUCATION

Establish High-Quality Schools in Gurgaon

To open schools in Gurgaon that provide high-quality education to underprivileged children within a nurturing and value-based Christian environment.

Expand Educational Institutions Across North India

To establish similar high-quality schools in towns across North India, along with well-equipped and adequately staffed Basic Literacy Centres (BLCs) and Adult Literacy Centres (ALCs) in rural and underserved areas.

Identify and Enroll Unschooled Children

To actively locate out-of-school children and facilitate their enrollment into appropriate educational institutions.

Provide Coaching for Working Youth (NIOS Pathway)

To set up coaching centres for students and working youth from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, enabling them to complete Grades 10 and 12 through the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS).

Offer Scholarships and Financial Assistance

To provide scholarships, stipends, and fee subsidies to deserving and financially needy students to support their access to higher (post-secondary) education.

Run Tuition Centres for Academic Support

To operate tuition centres that offer additional academic support for school-going children who require help to improve their performance.

Basic Literacy for Children (Ages 6–13)


To establish Basic Literacy Centres for children aged 6 to 13 who are out of school or have fallen behind. These centres will teach reading, writing, basic mathematics, and essential life skills, including personal hygiene, health awareness, and protection against trafficking.

Adult Literacy for Ages 14 and Above

To run Adult Literacy Centres for individuals above 14 years of age who have never received formal education, focusing on functional literacy and life skills related to health, hygiene, and financial awareness.

Vocational Training and Skill Development

To provide vocational training and skill development programs to literate adults, enhancing their employability and livelihood opportunities. Greenee Foundation plans to collaborate with the Government of India's Skill India Mission and other partners to expand access to industry-relevant training.




CARE FOR CHILDREN

- **Day-Care Centre for Working Families**

To establish an affordable, safe, and nurturing day-care centre for children from low-income families where both parents—or single mothers—are engaged in work. Many young mothers are forced to give up employment due to the lack of reliable child care. Our centre aims to support such families by providing a secure environment where their children are cared for during working hours.

- **Health and Nutrition Programs for Children in Urban Slums**

To launch targeted health and nutrition initiatives for children living in underserved slum communities across the city. Many of these children suffer from malnutrition and lack access to basic healthcare. Our field teams will actively engage with these communities to ensure that every child receives essential nutrition, regular health check-ups, and awareness on hygiene and preventive care.



Care for the aged and dying

- **Establishing an Inclusive Old-Age Home**
 - To set up a compassionate and inclusive old-age home that provides care and support to elderly individuals from across India—regardless of caste, creed, religion, or background. Our aim is to create a safe, respectful, and nurturing environment where the elderly can live with dignity and peace.
- **Palliative and End-of-Life Care**
 - To offer dedicated care for individuals in the final stages of life, particularly those suffering from terminal illnesses and beyond the scope of medical treatment. Our focus will be on providing dignity, comfort, emotional support, and love during their last days, ensuring they are not alone and are treated with the compassion they deserve.

Health and Hygiene Awareness for Women

To organize health and hygiene awareness camps and educational sessions specifically for women, aimed at promoting well-being, preventive healthcare, and informed lifestyle choices.

THE GENESIS



- Less than half of India's Children between the age group of 6 to 14 go to school.
- At least 35 million children aged 6-14 years do not attend school.
- In India, only 53% of habitation has a primary school and only 20% has a habitation of secondary school.
- On an average, an upper primary school is 3 km away in 22% of areas under habitations.
- On an average, there are less than three teachers per primary school. They have to manage classes from I to V every day.

THE GENESIS



These realities were firsthand observations by the Founder and his team—even in a city like Gurgaon, which accounts for nearly 70% of Haryana’s total annual economic investment. The stark contrast between wealth and poverty is undeniable, with hundreds of slums hidden in the shadows of the city’s gleaming high-rises. This visible divide highlights the urgent need for inclusive development and social equity.






Before establishing the organization, the founders had been working informally with underprivileged children for over a decade. During this time, their efforts—along with modest but meaningful accomplishments in education, women’s empowerment, and grassroots social outreach—served as a strong motivation to create a formal structure. The aim was simple: to expand their reach and impact, enabling many more children, women, and communities across the city—and eventually the nation—to benefit.

The visible social inequalities, the vulnerability of women in underserved communities, and the environmental degradation affecting the most marginalized, combined with the deeply personal experiences of the founding team, ultimately inspired the creation of the Greenee Foundation. It stands as a response born out of compassion, commitment, and a vision for long-term, inclusive, and sustainable change—championing education, human dignity, women's rights, and environmental responsibility.



Inception

Motivated by these realities and a deep desire to contribute meaningfully to India’s development, Greenee Foundation was founded by Ms. Nidhi on 12th August 2024 as an educational and charitable organization. For the founding directors, this initiative is more than just a project—it is a calling. A calling to respond to the needs of the poor, the forgotten, the marginalized, and the underprivileged across the nation with compassion, dignity, and action.


WOMEN’S EQUALITY AWARENESS SESSION


WORKSHOP ON CHARACTER STRENGTHS: UNLEASHING INNER POTENTIAL

REFORESTATION FOR A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE 🌳







In 2024–25, Greenee Foundation proudly implemented the “Sui Dhaaga Se Swavlamban Tak” initiative in Hisar, Haryana, empowering local women through tailoring skill development and entrepreneurial training. The program aimed to equip women—especially from underserved communities—with marketable skills, enabling them to generate income through home-based work, boutique startups, or employment in garment units. Through hands-on sessions, mentorship, and access to sewing machines and materials, participants gained not only technical skills but also financial literacy and confidence to pursue independent livelihoods. This initiative reflects our vision of empowerment through employment—turning stitches into strength and skills into self-reliance.
